
ATTENTION DURAND WATER CUSTOMERS

Beginning in July 2020, the Village will be completing a water system improvements project that entails the construction of a new well #3 and well house. The work will include new well pumps, chemical feed system, piping, valves, control, approximately 1,400 feet of 8-inch water main for well #4, SCADA controls system and site restoration. The project will also add sanitary sewer connections for both well houses which include; 484 feet of 8-inch PVC sewer pipe, four manholes for well #4, 68 feet of 4-inch and 138 feet of 8-inch PVC sewer pipe and two manholes for well #3.

The total project is estimated to cost \$2,032,537.62 and is being financed with 20-year 1.5% loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Public Water Supply Loan Program (PWSLP). The Village will also be securing \$800,00 in principal loan forgiveness from IEPA and a grant from DCEO in the amount of \$500,000. The final loan amount the Village will have to pay back is estimated at \$732,537.60.

The Public Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) is administered by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). A portion of the IEPA money to fund these types of projects comes from the US Environmental Protection Agency. SRF programs operate in each state to provide communities with the resources to build, maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects one of our most valuable resources: water.

The project will provide improved water service and water quality to the Village's water distribution system, along with improved fire flow.
