D. STREETS AND ALLEYS

The Rebuild grant has most likely been canceled and the Village will move forward with the Square Project with the assumption that no funds will be rewarded. Open roads will be patched and paved by the first week in November, weather permitting.

The Trustees discussed progress on the Well Project. A 20-foot liner is being looked into. The Spelman/Hopper Lot IEPA Release Process is being researched by the Village Attorney.
